### Make a Greek Mask





# **Background:**

Actors in Greek theatre wore masks to depict different characters and emotions. Very few of these masks survive though many images can be found on pottery and sculptures.

#### **Materials:**

- Large white paper plates
- Markers
- Scissors
- Construction paper
- Glue
- Elastic OR popsicle sticks

#### **Instructions:**

- 1. To make your own Greek mask first draw and cut out a large dinner plate-sized circle from cardboard.
- 2. Mark eyes and mouth on the cardboard, and carefully cut these out. Decorate as desired.
- 3. We used strips of colored construction paper for hair and beard. Cut thin strips, roll round pencil to give curly effect, and glue to mask.
- 4. Finally, either punch a hole on both sides of the mask and attach elastic so the mask can be worn, or tape a large popsicle stick or paint stirrer to the back of the mask and use as a handle to enable the mask to be held in front of your face.

5. OPTIONAL: If you position the smile in the middle of the mask, you can make it double-sided. The front can be a smiley face mask, and the back can be a frowny face mask. Very Greek!
